THE TASK FORCE ON HISTORIC PROPERTIES

CREATION AND PURPOSE

Senate Concurrent Resolution 95, enacted by the 1998 General Assembly, created the Task Force on Historic Properties in recognition of the need for cooperation, coordination, and long-term planning among the various state agencies with responsibilities for state-owned historic buildings and grounds.

The Task Force was charged by the General Assembly with assessing the status of the state's preservation, maintenance, and management efforts for state-owned historic properties and with recommending processes for centralized management, planning and data collection and accessibility.

(See Appendix I.)

SCR 95

"Conduct a study of the preservation, restoration, maintenance, oversight, and management of historic buildings and grounds owned by the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Members of the Task Force, as mandated by the resolution, included: a Senate and a House of Representatives member of the Capital Planning Advisory Board, appointed by the Legislative Research Commission; a Senate and a House of Representatives member of the Appropriations and Revenue Committee, appointed by the Legislative Research Commission; four citizen members with an interest and background in the preservation and maintenance of historic properties, appointed by the Legislative Research Commission; the Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Parks or his designee; the Commissioner of the Department of Facilities Management in the Cabinet for Finance and Administration or his designee; the Director of the Division of Historic Properties in the Cabinet for Finance and Administration or his designee; the Director of the Kentucky Historical Society or his designee; the Executive Director of the Kentucky Heritage Council or his designee; the State Budget Director or his designee; the Dean of the University of Kentucky College of Architecture or his designee; and the Director of the Forrest C. Pogue Public History Institute at Murray State University or his designee.

The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives were required to designate co-chairs of the task force from the members of the task force from their respective legislative chambers.

On July 1, 1998, the Legislative Research Commission approved the membership as detailed in the resolution and, in view of the importance of citizen preservation input, expanded the number of citizen members. (See Appendix II.)

The Task Force began monthly meetings in October, 1998, and met eight times. It submitted its findings and recommendations to the Capital Planning Advisory Board of the General Assembly on September 1, 1999.

PROCESS AND ACTIVITIES

The Task Force deliberations began with a description of the series of events that led to the creation of the Task Force - a series of events that began on the eve of Kentucky's 200th anniversary.

In 1991, the Kentucky Heritage Council, the Commonwealth Preservation Advocates, and the National Trust for Historic Preservation embarked on a major effort to document the Commonwealth's preservation needs and resources. In response to their report, "Historic Preservation Issues and Opportunities", the 1992 General Assembly created the Kentucky Historic Preservation Task Force. The 15-member Task Force was charged with evaluating historic preservation efforts in the Commonwealth and recommending programs and legislation that would provide a blueprint for protecting Kentucky's heritage.

The Kentucky Historic Preservation Task Force, consisting of four legislators and individuals representing preservation interests and constituencies throughout the state, evaluated existing historic preservation programs and services, identified gaps and needs, and researched model approaches from state and national organizations. The Task Force Final Report was issued on July 1, 1993. The report made numerous recommendations and detailed implementation proposals organized under the three broad themes of Development, Education, and Stewardship. While Heritage Council staff indicated that ten of the twenty-four recommendations proposed by the 1993 Task Force had been met in whole or in part (Status Report, Appendix IV), one recommendation, "Coordinated Management of State-Owned Sites" (Appendix III), had not only been neglected but the Interagency Council on Historic Preservation and Site Interpretation (Appendix V), on which it was based, had been inactive for approximately five years.

As a result of these events, during the 1998 Regular Session, the General Assembly created a Special Task Force on Historic Properties to examine the management of state-owned historic properties.

Who, What, When, Where And Why

To establish the scope of the issue and the nature of any problems, conflicts, or shortcomings, the Task Force heard testimony from various state agencies with responsibility for state-owned historic properties, including their review processes for preservation, restoration and maintenance, and the location, age, and condition of their properties.

An inventory of Kentucky State Government-Owned Buildings prepared in February 1999 by the state Division of Real Properties (Appendix VII) listed 735 projects at 87 separate sites which were fifty years old or older under the jurisdiction of fourteen different state agencies (Appendix VI).

Of the identified buildings, 33% belonged to institutions of higher education, 27% to Parks, 15% to Corrections and the remaining 25% to various agencies, including Finance and Administration, Health Services, Military Affairs, Fish and Wildlife, Education, Forestry, Housing Corporation, Justice, National Resources and Environmental Protection, Transportation and Workforce Development. Buildings on the inventory ran the gamut from the Old and New State Capitol to storage buildings, warehouses, and stock barns.

To try to cull old but not historically significant buildings from the inventory, the Task Force adopted the following definition for state-owned historic property:

"Any structure, building, district, or site owned and maintained by the Commonwealth of Kentucky that is at least fifty years old and is included in, or is eligible for inclusion in, the National Register of Historic Places. Eligible properties include those that are significant at the state or national level in the areas of history, architecture, or

archaeology. Historic significance means that the property displays distinctive characteristics of construction or building type, quality of workmanship, artistic merit, or has an important builder, craftsman, or architect. Archaeological significance means that the property has yielded or may yield information important to an understanding of history or prehistory. Properties significant under these criteria are, therefore, designated to receive the highest priority of care and preservation by the Commonwealth."

Using this refined definition of "historic property," the number of state-owned historic properties listed on the Division of Real Properties inventory was reduced from 735 to 157. While it was felt that this inventory represented the vast majority of state-owned historic properties, agencies interviewed suggested the need for a more thorough survey of actual sites.

Based on agency presentations, each state agency has its own internal quality standards and review processes for historic property maintenance and renovation. A summary of each affected agency's policies and procedures follows.

State Agency Oversight For State-Owned Historic Properties

Department of Facilities Management

The Department of Facilities Management oversees the procurement of architectural and engineering services for major renovation and restoration projects involving state-owned historic properties. Facilities Management assumes the responsibility and maintenance for most of the state-owned properties in the Frankfort area. The Department reports monitoring nineteen structures in the Capitol Complex within Franklin County and one London State Office Building in Laurel County.

Division of Historic Properties

The Division of Historic Properties functions under the auspices of the Department of Facilities Management. The Director of Historic Properties, who is the State Curator, serves as a member and secretary of the Historic Properties Advisory Commission and administers the historic properties endowment trust fund, for implementing the special functions of the Division. KRS 42.019 states that the Division of Historic Properties is responsible for overseeing the management and preservation of the Executive Mansion, the Old Governor's Mansion, the State Capitol, the Vest-Lindsey House, the Berry Hill Mansion, and the Henry Clay Law Office in Lexington. Additionally, the agency provides tourist information officers in the Capitol and mansions and staffs the Berry Hill Mansion and Vest-Lindsay House as meeting facilities. According to KRS 11.027 (2) the Historic Properties Advisory Commission has ultimate authority over any construction, repairs, structural restoration, or renovation of the Executive Mansion, the Old Governor's Mansion, and the New State Capitol.

The central office staff of five report that they advise and consult with other state agencies concerning construction and maintenance projects at their historic sites, including conducting on-site inspections and formulating plans for implementing modifications to comply with the federal guidelines of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Currently, the division's major advisory role is for the restoration of the Capitol Dome and insuring its historical integrity, a two-year project. Following completion of the dome renovation, the Division's next major project will be the restoration of the Capitol Building itself and consulting on the Capitol Master Plan.

Since 1996, Historic Properties has benefited from a cooperative agreement with the National Park Service, which has provided resources on various task directives. A recent grant furnished consultants from the National Park Service to advise and oversee restoration of the Jefferson Davis Monument in Fairview.

Department of Parks

The Department of Parks has been operational since 1924; originally there were only park sites. Today the Department is comprised of two major park divisions: the Division of Resort Parks, which contains seventeen large parks with overnight and restaurant accommodations, some of which have historical sites; and the Division of Recreational Parks and Historic Sites, which contains twenty-three distinct historic sites and fourteen museums, with over 40,000 artifacts. Further, Parks is responsible for two other historic homes which are currently leased to private foundations. (See Appendix VIII.)

As KRS 148 does not provide specific requirements by which the Department of Parks should operate the state-owned historic properties assigned to it, the Department has determined its own guidelines. To ensure that historical integrity is maintained, Parks utilizes the services of multiple state and federal agencies with appropriate expertise. Central office personnel conduct on-site inspections, including an annual walk-through with a maintenance checklist, for maintenance concerns, and park managers operate with a recurring maintenance calendar, which is updated quarterly. In addition, when major restoration is needed on historic facilities or historic sites, the agency consults with the Kentucky Heritage Council, the Division of Historic Properties, and the Kentucky Historical Society.

When Historic Properties prepared the *1986 Study of Historic Sites Operated by the Kentucky Department of Parks*, determining Park's renovation, maintenance and interpretation needs, the Department of Parks was in the process of revising its own procedures. After the evaluation was completed, Parks adopted many of the recommended procedures and incorporated them into its plan. While Parks has fulfilled dozens of the recommendations, some twenty-five items remain unaddressed. Administrators cite limitations caused by lack of skilled staff and continual repairs exceeding available dollars. Both Parks and Historic Properties personnel recognize the value in updating the original evaluation.

Kentucky Historical Society

Founded in 1836, the Kentucky Historical Society was one of the nation's earliest historic preservation groups. Currently, the Society enjoys a rather unique status as a dual-identity organization. It became a full-fledged state government agency in 1954, but it is also a nonprofit membership organization as well. Under the auspices of the Education, Arts and Humanities Cabinet, the Society pursues its mission to preserve and protect the history of the Commonwealth by offering diverse programs and publications that serve large numbers of citizens across the state.

The Kentucky Historical Society occupies some very unique historic properties, the most recognizable being the Old State Capitol. This well known Frankfort landmark served as the center of state government from 1830 to 1910, and two Kentucky Constitutions were drafted within its walls. The Old State Capitol was recognized as the first large building west of the Appalachians to be built in the Greek Revival style, and it is acknowledged by preservationists to be one of the nation's best remaining examples of this once popular architectural movement. Designed by the noted Kentucky architect Gideon Shryock, the building's best known feature is a unique self-supporting interior staircase constructed entirely from Kentucky limestone. The Old State Capitol has been designated a National Historic Landmark.

The Old State Capitol Annex, constructed in 1869, and the Barstow House, constructed in 1840, are also operated by the Historical Society. The Old State Arsenal, owned and maintained by Military Affairs, houses a Historical Society collection of military history items.

Cooperation is the key to the Historical Society's commendable stewardship of its properties. A highly trained curatorial staff and a full-time Facilities Manager oversee the Old State Capitol, the Old State Capitol Annex, the Barstow House, and the new Kentucky History Center. Actual maintenance work is carried out by employees of the state Finance Cabinet. Both the Kentucky Heritage Council and the Division of Historic Properties provide advisory support to the Society on an ongoing basis.

Kentucky Heritage Council

The Kentucky Heritage Council was established in 1966 to implement the provisions of the National Historic Preservation Act. Its primary purpose as the State Historic Preservation Office is to identify, protect, and preserve the historic structures and prehistoric resources which represent the Commonwealth's heritage.

The Council's responsibilities, as defined by state statute, include:

- Conducting an ongoing, comprehensive survey of historic properties.

- Nominating historic properties to the National Register of Historic Places.
- Developing effective working relationships with federal, state, and local agencies that participate in the management of historic properties and in project planning that may affect historic properties.
- Cooperating in the integration of historic preservation planning with all levels of planning.
- Cooperating in the development and maintenance of a review process for publicly funded, assisted and licensed undertakings that may affect historic properties within the state.
- Participating in the review of federal, federally-assisted, and federally-licensed undertakings that may affect historic properties included in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and Executive Order 11593.
- Assisting federal agencies in fulfilling their historic preservation responsibilities under federal law and regulations.
- Serving as a liaison with organizations of professional archaeologists, historians, architects, architectural historians, planners, and others concerned with historic preservation.
- Developing and providing a program of public information and education concerning the preservation program.
- Administrating the grants program within the state.
- Preparing and maintaining a comprehensive statewide preservation plan.

Additionally, the Council administers the Main Street program, to encourage revitalization and economic development in Kentucky cities. Through cooperative agreements with other state agencies, the Heritage Council also administers all ISTEA-funded projects involving historic properties and co-sponsors the Governor's Renaissance Kentucky downtown revitalization program.

The Council also reviews all rehabilitation work by owners of income-producing National Register properties seeking to qualify for federal preservation tax incentives and, through its staff renovation specialists, provides extensive technical assistance to historic property owners throughout the state. It has served, on an informal on-request basis, as a resource to state agencies undergoing maintenance and renovation of state-owned historic properties.

Other States' Review Processes For State-Owned Historic Properties

While most states have State Registers of Historic Places, only 40 have "State 106" laws, which provide for state review of and consultation on the impact of any state project on any historic site. Only six states - Florida, Connecticut, Minnesota, South Dakota, New Mexico, and Kansas - have state-level Section 4(f) laws to protect historic sites potentially harmed by state or locally funded highway projects.

Seventeen states have state environmental policy acts modeled after the national provisions. Of note, New York's "State Environmental Quality Review Act," or SEQRA, requires agencies to consider the effects of their actions on "local community character" as well as on historic and archaeological resources and the environment.

Of the many, and varied, state review processes, according to Kentucky Heritage Council staff, the North Carolina and New York provisions are generally considered the desired models. North Carolina's statutes direct the North Carolina Historical Commission to be a coordinating mechanism for competing public interests in instances where state undertakings are potentially in conflict with historic preservation (Citation Section 121-12(a)). The New York Public Buildings Law (Citation Section 63) directs the Commissioner of General Services, or the chief executive of any state agency, to consult with the Commissioner of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation as early as possible when altering, demolishing or transferring any state-owned historic property under their jurisdiction, with the goal of creating feasible alternatives. In cases where demolition or substantial alteration is unavoidable, the New York law requires that records be created of the property, following the standards of the Historic American Buildings Survey.

FINDINGS

A preliminary inventory of state-owned historic properties yielded a list of 735 buildings which are 50 years old or older, located at 87 separate sites, under the jurisdiction of 14 functional categories of state agencies.

Properties ranged from the Old and New State Capitol buildings to barns and warehouses. The adoption of a definition of "state-owned historic property" based on the National Register definition but refined by the requirement that historical, architectural or archaeological significance be established, reduced the list of identified properties on the inventory from 735 to 157.

by-agency survey would yield some additions, some deletions, and, perhaps most important, detailed data to evaluate the quality and condition of each property and the property's significance to the state.

Reports from state agencies with responsibility for state-owned historic property indicated that, typically, each state agency has its own internal review processes for managing maintenance and restoration of its historic property. Agency representatives expressed sincere concern for the protection and proper preservation of their historic properties and a sincere belief that they do the best they can within state budget constraints. All parties acknowledged a long list of funding needs for historic properties and a short list of available funds.

Generally, affected agencies felt that the current informal process of sharing data, resources, and expertise on an as-needed basis was sufficient to meet their needs, and that more formal requirements might be burdensome in terms of both time and money. However, most also recognized a value in an on-going working group who would evaluate the significance of state-owned historic properties, and a need for a professionally qualified preservation consultant to document a physical and financial plan for each significant property, so that a long-range plan for funding priorities, representing a united effort, could be presented to the Governor and the General Assembly.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Task Force On Historic Properties

Recommendations

SCR 95 requires the Task Force on Historic Properties to make recommendations relating to centralized management, the development of a long-term planning capability, and the development of a comprehensive database of historic properties and grounds to assure that state-owned historic buildings and grounds are preserved, restored, and maintained for future generations.

To this end, the following recommendations were adopted by the Task Force on Historic Properties at its August 16, 1999, meeting.

DEFINITION OF STATE-OWNED HISTORIC PROPERTY

RECOMMENDATION # 1

That the following definition be adopted for "state-owned historic property": Any structure, building, district, or site owned and maintained by the Commonwealth of Kentucky that is at least fifty years old and is included in, or is eligible for inclusion in, the National Register of Historic Places. Eligible properties include those that are significant at the state or national level in the areas of history, architecture, or archaeology. Historic significance means that the property displays distinctive characteristics of construction or building type, quality of workmanship, artistic merit, or has an important builder, craftsman, or architect. Archaeological significance means that the property has yielded or may yield information important to an understanding of history or prehistory. Properties significant under these criteria are, therefore, designated to receive the highest priority of care and preservation by the Commonwealth.

CENTRALIZED MANAGEMENT LONG-TERM PLANNING CAPABILITY

RECOMMENDATION # 1

That a Historic Properties Working Group (HPWG) of representatives from executive branch agencies which oversee state-owned historical property and representatives from the private sector be established and meet at least twice annually. That the HPWG include the Commissioner of the Department of Facilities Management, the Director of the Division of Historic Properties, the Commissioner of Parks, the Director of the Kentucky Historical Society, the Executive Director of the Kentucky Heritage Council and the chairs of the Kentucky Heritage Council, the Historic Properties Advisory Commission, and the Kentucky Historic Preservation Review Board, or their designees. That the Working Group be co-chaired by the State Historic Preservation Officer and the State Curator. That it be the responsibility of the Historic Properties Working Group to identify state-owned property to determine its historical, architectural, or archaeological significance.

RECOMMENDATION # 2

That the Historic Properties Working Group review and complete in 1999 the current survey on all state-owned properties at least fifty years old, to document for each site the construction date, historical information, construction method/materials, condition, use, dates and descriptions of major renovations, current and future renovation and maintenance schedules and descriptions, maps, and photographs (See "State-owned Historic Property Reporting Form, Appendix IX.)

That the Historic Properties Working Group analyze the returned survey forms to determine which properties are historically significant, based on the adopted definition of state-owned historic properties, and to determine the adequacy of each agency's review processes for state-owned historic property renovation and maintenance.

That the Historic Properties Working Group classify state-owned properties as to historical significance and priority for maintenance requiring expenditure of state funds. That affected state agencies be notified of properties considered to be state-owned historic properties and their classification.

RECOMMENDATION # 3

That the Department of Facilities Management, on behalf of the Historic Properties Working Group, provide affected state agencies with recommended changes in management policies, procedures, and responsibilities relating to state-owned historic properties.

RECOMMENDATION # 4

That the Historic Properties Working Group, after the initial state-owned historic property reporting form inventory, periodically update the inventory to account for maintenance and renovation and to identify properties newly qualifying by virtue of age or significance.

RECOMMENDATION # 5

That the Historic Properties Working Group develop, in consultation with affected state agencies, a process to review and comment on any proposed renovation/restoration project that involves replacing, repairing, altering or adding to the interior, exterior or immediate site of a state-owned historic property.

COMPREHENSIVE DATABASE

RECOMMENDATION # 1

That the Department of Facilities Management, on behalf of the Historic Properties Working Group, seek funding from the 2000 General Assembly for the development and maintenance of a state-owned property automated data base, to provide the following:

- for each state-owned historic property site, the construction date, historical information, construction method and materials, condition, use, dates and descriptions of major renovations, current and future renovation and maintenance schedules and descriptions, maps, and photographs,
- Internet access by state agencies and the public to data on state-owned historic properties, and
- annual update of state-owned property inventory, to account for maintenance and renovation and to identify properties newly qualifying by virtue of age or significance.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 95

AS ENACTED

TUESDAY, MARCH 31, 1998

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION directing the Legislative Research Commission to create a Task Force on Historic Properties.

WHEREAS, the preservation, restoration, oversight, and funding of historic buildings and grounds are important endeavors in maintaining and enhancing the quality of life of citizens of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and

WHEREAS, the preservation, restoration, oversight, and funding of historic buildings and grounds create many new jobs, create many opportunities to attract new businesses, attract many tourists, and have a positive impact on the economic well-being of the citizens of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and

WHEREAS, the preservation, restoration, oversight, and funding of historic buildings and grounds have played an important role in maintaining and enhancing the business, social, and religious communities throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and

WHEREAS, the responsibility for the preservation and management of historic buildings and grounds owned by the Commonwealth is dispersed among different cabinets and agencies of state government, and

WHEREAS, Kentucky state government officials and the Kentucky General Assembly recognize the need for cooperation, coordination, and long-term planning among agencies with responsibilities for historic buildings and grounds;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

1 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is directed to create a Task Force
2 on Historic Properties to conduct a study of the preservation, restoration, maintenance,
3 oversight, and management of historic buildings and grounds owned by the
4 Commonwealth of Kentucky, and to make recommendations relating to centralized
5 management, the development of a long term planning capability, and the development of

1 a comprehensive database of historic properties and grounds to assure that state-owned
 2 historic buildings and grounds are preserved, restored, and maintained for future
 3 generations.

4 Section 2. The members of the Task Force on Historic Properties shall include the

8 (2) A Senate and a House of Representatives member of the Appropriations and
 9 Revenue Committees, appointed by the Legislative Research Commission;

10 (3) A member of the Senate and a member of the House of Representatives

Coordinated Management of State-Owned Sites

Summary:

The Commonwealth owns hundreds of historic buildings and sites which are listed in the National Register of Historic Places. This large and varied inventory of historic and prehistoric sites is managed by a wide variety of state agencies. These agencies have diverse missions, and most lack staff familiar with cultural resource management techniques or internal management guidelines that require sensitivity to historic properties.

The Task Force reviewed the existing cooperative management programs with the Director of the Tourism Cabinet's Historic Parks Department, the Director of the Office of Historic Properties, and the Deputy Commissioner of the Department for Facilities Management, which provides capital project oversight. The Kentucky Heritage Council's advisory role in the historic site management process was also considered. All agreed that the established management programs could be strengthened. Additionally, many state-owned historic resources have not been recognized as having special management or restoration needs. These are administered without the oversight and advice of a historic preservation agency.

In order to best use limited funds and to avoid

programmatic and management conflicts, planning for the preservation of historic and prehistoric sites should be coordinated among all the agencies involved. The coordination process needs to occur at the onset of the planning process for renovation, new construction, education, interpretation and curation activities. Affected agencies include the Kentucky Heritage Council, the Kentucky Historical Society, the Department of Parks, the Department of Transportation, and the Department for Facilities Management.

The Task Force concluded that a process involving a standard planning and review procedure for projects affecting state-owned historic properties is needed. Discussion regarding the type of activity affected, the type of properties covered and the mechanics of such a process should continue, with consideration of oversight responsibility provided by a Review Board Agency, State Official or ongoing Interagency Advisory Committee.

The Task Force endorses the Governor's recent executive action creating an Interagency Council including the agencies listed above. The Council could have ongoing responsibility for further consideration and implementation of the Task Force recommendations.

Implementation:

No additional funding or staff would be required.

Increased sharing of specialized staff, equipment and services. Consider establishing an ongoing role for the Interagency Council to oversee internal implementation of several Task Force recommendations, as listed in

Chapter VI. If this occurs, it may be useful to include representation from major land-owning state agencies with management responsibilities for archaeological resources, such as the Division of Forestry, Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources and the Nature Preserves Commission.

**INTERAGENCY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION
AND SITE INTERPRETATION**

WHEREAS, the responsibility for the preservation and management of historic sites and artifacts owned by the Commonwealth is dispersed among different agencies of state government; and,

WHEREAS, Kentucky state government officials recognize the need for cooperation, coordination, and long-term planning among agencies with responsibilities for historic sites and artifacts; and

WHEREAS, such efforts will be better served by centralized leadership and coordination of activities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BRERETON C. JONES, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by KRS 12.029, do hereby order and direct the following:

1. There is created and established an Interagency Council for Historic Preservation and Site Interpretation, hereinafter referred to as the Council, which shall be an advisory group. The Council shall be chaired by the Secretary, Education, Arts and Humanities Cabinet.

2. The Council shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

a. To coordinate activities relating to the management and preservation of historic sites and artifacts currently carried on by state government by utilizing present resources.

b. To draw upon the expertise of those persons charged with the responsibilities for historic sites and artifacts in Kentucky.

c. To provide a means by which information can be shared and to establish an ongoing communication to effect cooperation among the agencies in state government involved with historic sites and artifacts.



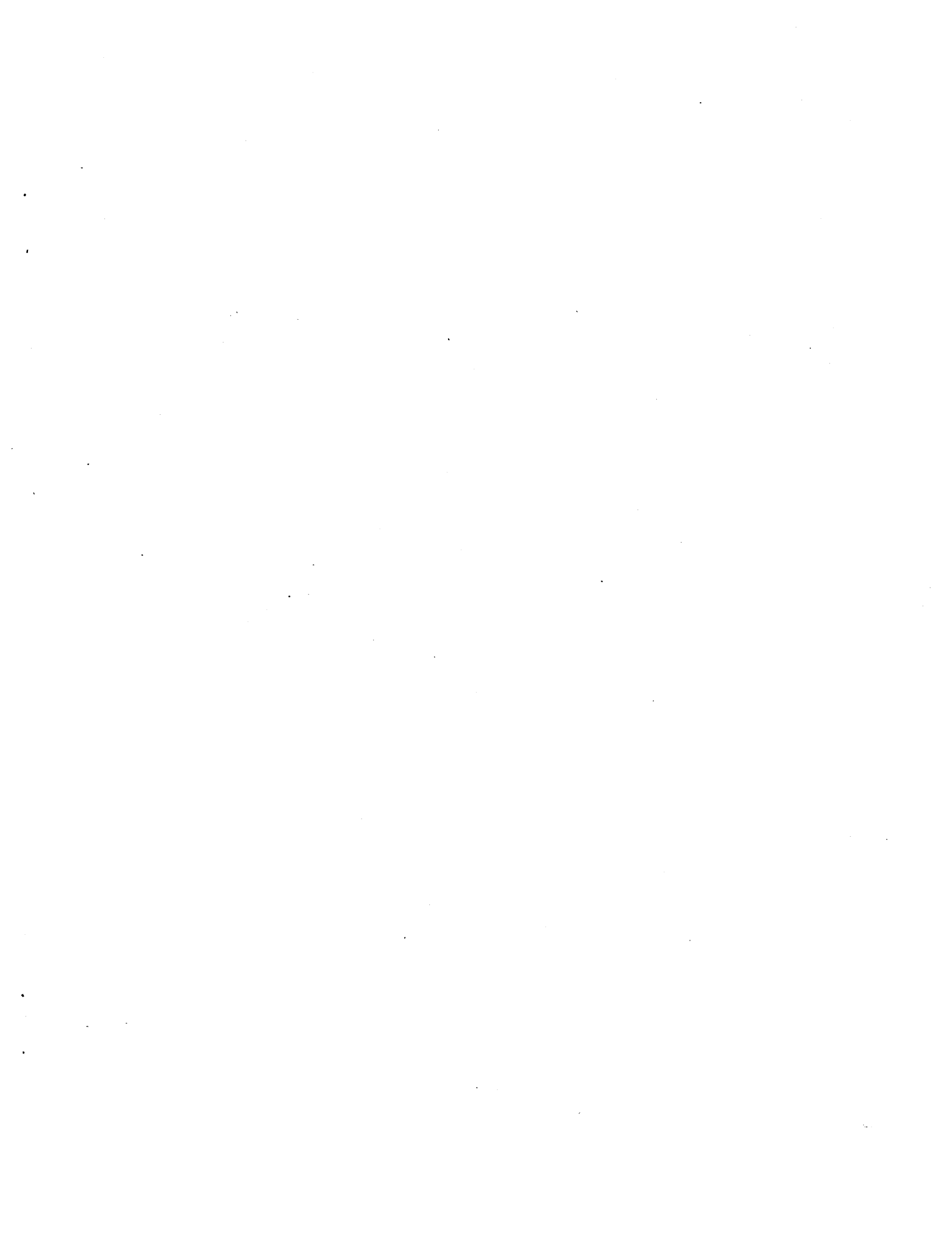

Instructions for completing a Kentucky State-owned Historic Property Reporting Form

1. **NAME OF BUILDING, STRUCTURE, OBJECT, DISTRICT, OR SITE:** Fill in the name of the resource, for example, "Smith House", "Bluegrass Station", or "Lock & Dam 12". If no name is known, use a generic one such as "log house," or the address of the resource's location.
2. **ADDRESS/LOCATION:** Give the resource's street address, or if none, its location (for example, "3/10 of a mile South on route 123 from intersection with route 456").
3. **STATE AGENCY/ADDRESS:** Give the name and address of the state agency which owns the resource.
4. **NAME AND CONTACT INFORMATION OF PERSON COMPLETING THE FORM:** Your name and how to contact you (phone, address, e-mail).
5. **DATE RECORDED:** Date you completed the form.
6. **CONSTRUCTION DATE:** Date the resource was built, if known, or estimate if not known.
7. **CONSTRUCTION METHOD/MATERIAL:** Examples: log, brick, frame, stone, etc.
8. **CONDITION:** Excellent, good, fair, poor, ruins.

15. **(OPTIONAL) FLOOR PLAN AND/OR SITE PLAN:** Especially for resources such as houses and churches, it can be useful to have a sketch plan of the building. A site plan is useful if there are multiple buildings on one location, as at a farmstead.
